Standards for Health Education:

- TC: Acquire knowledge and skills to understand the True Colors model for understanding yourself and others based on your personality temperament. (Kali True Color test)
- ATOD Acquire knowledge and skills to understand the physical, social, emotional effects of alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs and their use.(Drugs, Alcohol, PEDs)
- NUT Acquire knowledge and skills to understand and practice healthful nutrition that contributes to growth and energy and helps prevent chronic diseases. (Nutrition and Physical Fitness)
- MH Acquire knowledge and skills to understand that mental, social and emotional health contributes to building and maintaining interpersonal relationships (Mental Health/Stress- addictive behaviors, anger management, eating disorders etc.)
- FIT Acquire knowledge and skills to understand the role physical activity has in promoting health. (Nutrition and Physical Fitness)
- REP Acquire knowledge and skills that emphasize the importance of safe behaviors in maintaining sexual health.

 (Reproductive System, Pregnancy & Childbirth/ABSTINENCE Birth Control)
- SUI Acquire knowledge and skills to prevent different forms of violence and suicide with a focus on communication and pro social behaviors. (Teen Suicide)
- FH: Acquire knowledge of the importance of families and the role students play in the families (Family Health)
- GS: Acquire knowledge in understanding how gender roles can be defined as a set of social and behavioral norms that are generally considered appropriate for either a man or a woman in society. (Gender Stereotyping)

Guest Presentations: Center For Hope and Safety – Topics: sexual violence, teen dating violence, pornography and how viewing pornography increases the chances a person will be sexually violent, sex trafficking, and bystander intervention. Trauma Nurses Talk Tough – Topics: distracted driving, driving under the influence, drug use.
