Dear Parents:

We have a 1 hour block of time on Thursdays beginning at 2:05 p.m. and ending at 3:05 p.m. called “RIE”. This “Remediation, Intervention and Extension” time **is still part of the regular school day**. Buses will run during their normal times. Students who are missing assignments, failing, or near failing any classes will be required to stay, either to work with the teacher who requested them or to complete work in their Advisory Group area. If a teacher requests that a student stay, he or she must do so. Students may be requested by up to two teachers during this time. Teachers will submit a list of students who need to attend RIE on Thursday; those students will then be scheduled. The RIE List will be posted in the lower hallway each Wednesday and it is the responsibility of the student to check and see if they are on the list. It is possible that a student with a D or F may not be requested (due to large numbers, etc.) by one of their teachers. In that event, the AG teacher will require the student to stay and work – the AG teacher has the final say in this matter. **If students skip RIE, they will attend Saturday School.**

The purpose of RIE is to give all levels of students more specific time for instruction with a teacher. Students who may have missed a test or a lab will now have time during the day to make up those tasks. While it may seem fairly obvious how this time will benefit students who may be struggling in different content areas, the extension piece of this schedule will provide different types of learning experiences for students as well. For example, each department will organize extension lesson once a month or students in AP courses will be able to meet with their teacher to receive additional instruction in preparation for the AP exam.

This time gives students who are not requested by a teacher to work on projects for other areas or activities including Link Crew, FBLA or Leadership. This will also be a time when students can attend college or career prep workshops offered through the Counseling Department. Additionally, we are planning on hosting college visitations.

For students who do not wish to leave campus, we will have supervised areas such as the commons and computer labs available until after school activities begin or the buses arrive.

We ask that you do not schedule your students for appointments during this time as it can make the difference between a diploma, scholarship, college, or a career opportunity. Additionally, those students with an “early release”, if requested, will need to make arrangements to stay and complete their necessary tasks.

Finally, at the bottom of this page is a permission form for you to sign allowing your student to leave campus **if a staff member does not request them**. It is possible that students will decide never to leave; however, we want to make sure that if your student decides to do so, it is with your permission.
