- 6. Use the practice interview questions below to complete one of the below options.
 - Practice in partner groups with the sample interview questions.
 - 1. Greet each other with a handshake. (Firm, web to web, up and down.)
 - 2. Ask 5 interview questions.
 - 3. Switch roles and ask 5 additional questions.

OR

- Practice the same as above except in front of the class as opposed to small groups.
- 7. End advisory according to personal preference.

Sample Interview Questions:

- What would you say are your most valuable job skills or traits? ***
- What would your co-workers or classmates say you are the "go-to" person for?
- What motivates you to do your best on the job?
- Why is customer service so important in business today?
- Tell me about a time when you were in a high-pressure situation at work or school.
- Tell me how you solved a problem you confronted at school or work.
- What do you think are the most important abilities that lead to success on the job?
- What role do you prefer when working on a team project? Why?
- How would your classmates or co-workers describe your contributions in the classroom/workplace?
- Tell me about a time that you made a suggestion that was implemented by classmates or co-workers.
- Describe your work ethic in the school or work environment.
- What would you do if one supervisor told you to do something and another supervisor contradicted it?
- Give me a specific example of a disappointment you have experienced as a student or an employee.
- You just learned that a project you were working on at school or work failed, how do you respond?
- What skills/traits do you value in co-workers or classmates?
- What questions do you have for me? ***
