Procedure:

1. Begin advisory according to personal preference.
2. Take attendance.
3. Read Announcements.
4. **Objective:** Explore Career options and decide on an EA Project
5. If any student has not taken the survey, tell them to go on the EA project website and take the survey.
6. Lead the same discussion with your class to determine what information students need in order to make a decision about their EA project. Which project are they leaning towards? What questions do they still have about the project? What information do they need in order to make a decision?
7. Survey the class and figure out who has and who has not decided on a project. Students who have decided may take the rest of the class period to get organized and begin working on their EA project.
8. For any students who have not decided, talk with them and try to help them navigate making a decision. They may research options online or talk with a friend to work through their thoughts and decision making process. Remind them that just because you decide on a specific project, doesn't mean you are locking yourself into a specific career. It's okay to do a project and then realize it's not for you.
9. Tell students that they will have one more EA Project centered lesson before Summer Break. The rest of the year will be devoted to Internet Safety Lessons, SBAC, and Reflecting on the school year.
10. End advisory according to personal preference.
